

Chambers County Youth Project Show Livestock Committee

Purpose

The CCYPS Livestock Committee exists to provide an opportunity for the youth of Chambers County to meet in the spirit of friendly competition to exhibit and potentially auction livestock projects for which they are responsible.

Scope

The CCYPS is open to all youth who have not graduated from 12th grade and meet at least one of the following criteria:

- Attend Anahuac, East Chambers, or Barbers Hill ISD
- Are home-schooled in Chambers County
- Live in Chambers County and are in good standing with Chambers County 4-H

Rules Interpretation

The CCYPS Livestock Committee has the final authority to interpret all rules. If a rule's meaning is in question, the division chairman or a quorum of voting committee members may decide on its interpretation. This decision will stand for the duration of the show until a formal meeting establishes a permanent interpretation.

There are 11 voting-eligible committees: Advisory, Breeding Beef, F-1/Commercial Heifer, Goat, Grounds, Lamb, Poultry, Rabbit, Scramble, Steer, and Swine.

For the Livestock Committee, both the Vice Chairman (if applicable) and Secretary may vote. The Chairman votes only in the event of a tie.

A quorum requires seven committee members.

Responsibility

The CCYPS Livestock Committee, unless otherwise specified, assumes no responsibility for exhibitors, their actions or their project. The following rules and regulations provide for reasonable care and diligence in providing a suitable place to exhibit projects.

New and/or Updated Rules

General Rules, Rule 4

Due to UIL eligibility regulations, exhibitors must notify the CCYPS of a change in school enrollment and/or club membership no later than April 1. Changing school enrollment and/or club membership after this date may result in barring of participation in the event.

General Rules, Rule 12

All livestock projects must be shown and sold by the owner of that project, unless approved in advance by the Chairman of that Division. Approval for alternates will only be granted due to illness, death in the family disability of the exhibitor or approved UIL event. (Proms/dances DO NOT qualify for an exemption.)

Auction Rules, Rule 1

The number of lots in the Youth Auction is currently under review by the Livestock Committee and may differ from previous years. The Committee will determine the final number of auction lots based on total entries received, buyer participation and interest, and historical sale trends. The goal is to establish an auction structure that best benefits exhibitors while ensuring buyers receive the greatest value for their support. Final auction numbers will be announced as soon as the Committee reaches a decision.

Barn Sale Rules, Rule 5

The Chambers County Youth Project Show (CCYPS) will provide a list of minimum recommended asking prices for all animals sold through the Barn Sale. This list will be made available to exhibitors at the time projects are signed up for the Barn Sale. Exhibitors may choose to list their projects at a price higher than the recommended minimum; however, projects listed above the recommended price are not guaranteed to sell.

General Rules and Regulations

All exhibitors are subject to the General Rules and Regulations and the Livestock Division Regulations of the CCYPS. Exhibitors are responsible for reading through and abiding by all applicable rules. The Chambers County Youth Project Show Livestock Committee reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard, thereto or otherwise rising out of connection with or incident to the show.

1. The CCYPS is open to all youth who have not graduated from the 12th grade and who meet at least one of the following criteria: attends Anahuac, East Chambers or Barbers Hill ISD; is home-schooled in Chambers County, Texas; or who lives in Chambers County and is in good standing with the Chambers County 4-H Program. There are no exceptions to this rule.
2. Exhibitors of small animals (goats, lambs, swine, poultry and rabbits) must be five-years-old as of show date to enter their project. Exhibitors of large animals (cattle) must be eight-years-old as of show date to enter their project.
3. All exhibitors in grades 3 through 12 must be members in good standing of and exhibit their projects under 4-H, Junior FFA or FFA. Only exhibitors between the ages of five-years-old and the completion of the second grade may exhibit their project as an Independent exhibitor.
4. Due to UIL eligibility regulations, exhibitors must notify the CCYPS of a change in school enrollment and/or club membership no later than April 1. Changing school enrollment and/or club membership after this date may result in barring of participation in the event.
5. The CCYPS will not seek excused absences on behalf of any students. Exhibitors wishing to be excused for absences obtained during participation in the CCYPS should seek guidance from their 4-H or FFA Advisor.
6. Exhibitors participating as Independents (not under 4-H or FFA) are responsible for obtaining their own absence excuses. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to review the Important Deadlines page and to ensure that their entries are submitted no later than the correct date and time. It is also the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that they follow each of the rules laid out in this Livestock Rulebook.
7. All entries must be exhibited as entered. No change of ownership is permitted after the entry deadline.
8. Animals may be family-tagged within the same division in most cases. To family tag, the number of animals in a division must equal or exceed the number of exhibitors – for example, two children must tag in at least two commercial heifers to family tag. There must be a separate entry for each exhibitor and the exhibitor who will show the animal must be designated at check in.
 - a. Please note: Chambers County Steers and Commercial Steers are two separate divisions, as are Commercial Heifers and F-1 Heifers.
 - b. Who can family tag? To family tag, exhibitors must either live in the same home or be members of the same nuclear family, including families blended by marriage (e.g. step siblings).
9. No CCYPS Official is permitted to remove any existing ear tag from the ear of an animal, including: plastic flock ID tags, Scrapie 840 RFID tags, metal flock ID tags, breeder ID tags or tags from any of the five major shows or South Texas State Fair.

Should an exhibitor want a CCYPS tag placed in an existing ear tag hole at tag in, the tag MUST be removed BY THE EXHIBITOR prior to arrival on the specified date of tag in. No out of state show tags are permitted to remain in the animal's ear.

10. Exhibitors who participate in the Scramble and are awarded either a scramble or hard-luck sponsorship may tag in up to two animals in the division which they choose to enter their scramble project, but MUST turn in a scramble report (with correct ear tag number) for BOTH animals. This means that, for example, if an exhibitor plans to show a lamb they may tag in two lambs, but must turn in two scramble reports each month – one for each animal. The exhibitor must designate the animal which they plan to show at the time of check in.
11. The scales used during check in are official and are certified by the Texas Department of Agriculture before the show each year.
12. All livestock projects must be shown and sold by the owner of that project, unless approved in advance by the Chairman of that Division. Approval for alternates will only be granted due to illness, death in the family disability of the exhibitor or approved UIL event. (Proms/dances DO NOT qualify for an exemption.)
13. Each exhibitor may show in any of the market divisions for which they are age-eligible. However, an exhibitor may only show one entry per division.
14. All market animals entered in the show are subject to random drug residue testing. Testing will be performed by a representative of the Texas Animal Health Commission. If evidence of drug residue is found, the exhibitor will be barred from any farther or future CCYPS and all monies and prizes won will be forfeited.
15. Animals entered in divisions which require CCYPS ear tags must have their assigned tags to show. Permission to replace lost ear tags can only be given by the Chairman of the appropriate Division. Exhibitors must notify the Division Chairman or the CCYPS Office within one week of the loss of the tag.
16. All animals must be housed in the assigned barn. Animals are not permitted to be housed at trailers.
17. Sifted animals must be removed from the grounds immediately.
18. Small Animal Showmanship classes will be broken into four age divisions: PeeWee (5-7 years old), Junior (8-11 years old), Intermediate (12-14 years old) and Senior (15 to 18 years old). Large Animal Showmanship is open only to those exhibitors in the Junior Intermediate and Senior age levels. **There is no PeeWee Showmanship in any cattle class.** Exhibitors participating in Showmanship classes must use the animal that they exhibited in the regular class.
19. Class breaks, auction order and other pertinent information will be posted on the bulletin board at the bottom of Tommy's Tower.
20. Exhibitors and show officials are the only persons allowed in the show arena.
21. Exhibitors in any division with unruly animals will be given two chances to control their animals. After the second chance has been given, show officials may ask the exhibitor to leave the arena with their animal and be disqualified from that division.
 - a. If an animal must be tied to the fence due to unruly behavior, CCYPS Officials will instruct the Judge to place the animal last in its class.
22. Exhibitors who do not behave with maturity during shows will be asked to leave the arena by show officials.
23. The CCYPS is dedicated to providing an inclusive environment where young people of all ability levels are able to safely participate. As such, the Livestock Committee may allow exhibitors to have an assistant present during the exhibition of their project

when the exhibitor has a physical or mental disability that prevents proper handling of the animal without assistance. Any request for an assistant must be presented to the CCYPS Livestock Committee in writing no later than the March Committee Meeting. Assistants must be current YPS exhibitors.

- a. In the event that an assistant is required and approved, the assistant shall provide the least amount of interference as possible for the exhibitor to properly display the animal and shall not interfere with any other exhibitor or otherwise block the path or view of the Judge.
24. All exhibits which are chosen for auction must be sold by the owner of the project using the animal exhibited (except in the Swine division), unless otherwise approved by the Chairman of that Division. Approval for alternates will only be granted due to illness, death in the family, disability of the exhibitor or approved UIL event. (Proms/dances DO NOT qualify for an exemption.)
25. All Grand and Reserve Champion market projects must sell in the Auction.
26. Stall paraphernalia must be left in the stall until the completion of the Auction.
27. Exhibitors of market projects who choose not to sell their animal through the Barn Sale or Auction must notify the CCYPS Office by 8 a.m. on auction day. Animals may not be removed from the event grounds until the designated check out time on Sunday.
28. Only those projects that sell through either the Auction or Barn Sale are permitted to receive Add On Donations through the CCYPS.
29. During the development of the project, animals must be maintained at the home of the exhibitor. Exhibitors who do not raise their animals at their home must provide written explanation via the enclosed Off Premises Form. This form must be submitted at the time of entry and a form is required for every unique project not kept at the home of the exhibitor. Any violation of this rule will forfeit the opportunity to sell the project as part of the Auction or Barn Sale. All exhibits are subject to on-site inspections by members of the CCYPS Livestock Committee.
30. Each exhibitor's academic eligibility (House Bill 72) will be determined by the school district they attend. Enforcement of House Bill 72 is the responsibility of the school district and exhibitor.
31. Adults of legal drinking age (21 years or older) may only consume alcoholic beverages from unmarked cups while on show grounds. No bottles or cans will be permitted. Drug and drug paraphernalia is strictly prohibited. Exhibitors found to be in possession of alcohol or illegal drugs will be banned from the show and their project must be removed from the grounds immediately.
32. Only individuals of legal driving age are permitted to operate golf carts, ATVs, etc. on Youth Project Show grounds.
33. With the exception of service animals, no dogs are permitted in any barn where show animals are stalled nor are they permitted in show arenas.
34. All protests must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100, cash or check, which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Written protests must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the CCYPS Livestock Committee Chairman or CCYPS Office immediately after the occasion which is the cause of the protest. The project in question will be immediately monitored by the Livestock Committee until a decision is reached.
35. The CCYPS Livestock Committee reserves the right to amend these rules as it may deem necessary. Amendments made after publication of this rulebook might not appear in writing until the following year.

36. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this rulebook forfeits all privileges, awards and premiums won.
37. The CCYPS Livestock Committee permits the ethical fitting of animals for show but prohibits the following unethical fitting practices: tubing/pumping, twining/adding artificial hair, and airing. The CCYPS Livestock Committee shall, in its sole discretion, determine whether an animal has been unethically fitted and may, in its sole discretion, disqualify the exhibit. Such determinations are final and binding on the exhibitor and not subject to appeal or protest.
38. The CCYPS is a family-friendly event. As such, an individual's conduct as an exhibitor, show official or patron should be exemplary. Any person who exhibits behavior that is unbecoming is subject to disqualification and/or removal from show grounds. Prohibited behavior includes, but is not limited to:
 - a. Disruptive or improper conduct
 - b. Public displays of profanity of any sort
 - c. Violence of any sort
 - d. Provision of alcohol to underage persons or providing the space for consumption of alcohol by underage persons
 - e. Possession, use or distribution of alcohol by underage persons
 - f. Excessive consumption of alcohol

Auction Rules and Regulations

1. **The number of lots in the Youth Auction is currently under review by the Livestock Committee and may differ from previous years. The Committee will determine the final number of auction lots based on total entries received, buyer participation and interest, and historical sale trends. The goal is to establish an auction structure that best benefits exhibitors while ensuring buyers receive the greatest value for their support. Final auction numbers will be announced as soon as the Committee reaches a decision.**
2. Sale order will be as follows: Grand Champion Chambers County Steer, Commercial Steer, Commercial Heifer, F-1 Heifer, Swine, Lamb, Goat, Broilers, Rabbits and Industrial Arts. All others will sell in numerical order as the division was judged and placed. Grand Champion Baked Goods for Senior, Intermediate and Junior age levels and Grand and Reserve Floral Design projects will be sold at the conclusion of the Grand Champion, Reserve Champion and third place sale items, respectively.
3. All Grand and Reserve Champion projects must sell in the auction.
4. No Reserve Champion project from any division will be permitted to sell for more than that which the Grand Champion of that division sold. Further, projects placing below the Reserve Champion will not be permitted to sell for more than the Reserve Champion project.
5. All exhibitors who sell their project through the auction are required to have a photo taken of them and their project – either with or without their buyer. The fee for the picture will be deducted from the exhibitor's proceeds. The photo will be presented to the buyer by the CCYPS on the exhibitor's behalf.
6. Auction announcement cards will be permitted for seniors only. These cards will be provided by the CCYPS Office and must be picked up prior to the Auction Buyer's Dinner. No outside cards will be accepted or read at the auction. Once the card has been completed by the participant, it must be hand-delivered to either the exhibitor's Ag Teacher or County Extension Agent in advance of the auction to be approved. It is the responsibility of the Ag Teacher/Agent to deliver the card to the appropriate party at the auction.
7. No animal will be resold in the auction.
8. No "For Sale" signs shall be permitted in the barn before the auction begins.
9. If for any reason a project which has qualified for the auction withdraws, all projects following shall be raised one place to complete the full sale order. The final deadline for exhibitors to withdraw animals from the sale is 8 a.m. on the day of the auction.
10. Exhibitors who pull their project from the auction without notifying the CCYPS will forfeit their eligibility for one year and will not be able to participate in the CCYPS the following year.
11. Exhibitors may only sell two market projects in the auction. Should an exhibitor have multiple projects qualify for the auction it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to notify the CCYPS office which project(s) they wish to remove from the auction. If the office is not notified by the deadline listed above, the Livestock Committee reserves the right to choose on behalf of the exhibitor.
12. Exhibitors must report to the auction ring entrance at least 10 items prior to their auction slot, prepared to enter the arena.

13. All market livestock which is sold in either the auction or the barn sale must sell through the CCYPS Livestock Committee. Checks should be made payable to CCYPS.
14. Buyers or a responsible agent must be present at the time of the sale – both for the auction or the barn sale – and must sign the Auction Card to confirm the purchase.
15. Auction Cards must be filled out completely.
16. Once an animal has been purchased through the auction, neither the exhibitor, exhibitor's parent/guardians nor any member of the Livestock Committee may approach the buyer to purchase or exchange the animal for any reason.
17. No project is permitted to leave the CCYPS grounds until the official check out time on Sunday. All exhibitors are responsible for the feeding and watering of their livestock projects until the designated check out time (see the Schedule of Events). A five percent penalty will be applied to any monies earned at the show if the exhibitor does not fulfill these duties. Furthermore, a five percent penalty may also be applied if the exhibitor or their agent is not present to check out and load projects on check out day.
18. Exhibitors will not receive money earned from the sale of their project until they turn in completed thank you notes to the CCYPS Office. The CCYPS Office will send a list of all required thank you notes to the exhibitor once all sales and add ons have been entered. Exhibitors have two weeks from the sending of this list to turn in their thank you notes.
19. Checks will be made available to exhibitors for their projects as soon as possible, however no payment will be made earlier than two weeks after the show. When checks are available, the CCYPS Office will contact exhibitors directly to notify them regarding pick up procedures. No checks will be mailed.

Barn Sale Rules and Regulations

1. Exhibitors whose project does not place high enough to sell through the auction are permitted to list their project for sale through the Barn Sale book.
2. Exhibitors must list projects they wish to sell in the Barn Sale book by 10 a.m. on auction day. Projects not listed in the Barn Sale book are not eligible to be sold through the CCYPS.
3. Exhibitors who choose not to sell their project through the Barn Sale must notify the CCYPS Office by 10 a.m. on auction day and must sign an exhibitor release at that time.
4. Exhibitors listed in the Barn Sale Book **are not guaranteed to sell.**
5. The Chambers County Youth Project Show (CCYPS) will provide a list of **minimum recommended asking prices** for all animals sold through the Barn Sale. This list will be made available to exhibitors at the time projects are signed up for the Barn Sale. Exhibitors may choose to list their projects at a price higher than the recommended minimum; however, projects listed above the recommended price are **not guaranteed to sell.**
6. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to check the Barn Sale book periodically during the show to ensure that their project has been purchased.
7. Projects which are not purchased must be taken home by the exhibitor or sent to a packer by the exhibitor on checkout day.
8. Projects sold through the Barn Sale are eligible to receive Add On Donations. Projects that are listed in the Barn Sale book but that do not sale **are not** eligible to receive Add On Donations.
9. The Barn Sale Book is open to buyers and exhibitors from the end of the F-1 Heifer Show until 8 a.m. on checkout day. **No sales will be permitted after 8 a.m. on checkout day.**
10. Buyers who purchase projects through the Barn Sale must sign the auction card immediately upon marking that item as sold.

Cattle Show Divisions

Exhibitors are responsible for the proper classing of their cattle at the time of entry. All animals will be shown in the class in which they are entered.

Animals should be classed based on age as of show date, when appropriate.

Unregistered cattle should be entered in the AOB/Other Breeds class. If an animal is entered into a registered class but registration paperwork is either not turned into the CCYPS Office by the appropriate deadline or the animal is not registered appropriately, the animal will be moved to the AOB/Other Breeds class at the time of the show.

For the purpose of the CCYPS, cattle classes are as follows:

The CCYPS reserves the right to break down the above classes as the discretion of the judge.

Commercial Heifer Division

1. All Commercial Heifers must be entered by the date and according to the method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
2. All Commercial Heifer entries must attend the mandatory Large Animal Tag In (see Important Dates page) at White Memorial Park to be tattooed, tagged and weighed.
 - a. The CCYPS will accept major show validation tags in lieu of inserting a new tag into the animal's ear at tag in, but the animal **MUST** be tattooed with the unique CCYPS mark at tag in to be shown.
3. Commercial Heifers **MUST** be purchased from Chambers County or a surrounding county (Liberty, Harris, Jefferson or Galveston).
4. Heifers may be any composition of breeds or pure bred. No registration papers are required for heifers to be shown in this division.
5. A completed, notarized Commercial Heifer Agreement must be turned in at the time of tag in with the breeder's signature and herd address. Failure to submit this form may result in barring from participation.
6. Commercial Heifers must weigh between 400 and 900 pounds on the date of tag in. A ten pound tolerance will be allowed. Animals will be weighed immediately upon arrival at tag in.
7. Commercial Heifers must gain a minimum of 300 pounds between the date of tag in and show check in, with a 10 pound tolerance. Heifers failing to gain at least 300 pounds will immediately be sifted and removed from show grounds. Heifers that do not make weight will be reweighed immediately after zeroing the scales.
8. Exhibitors may enter both the F-1 Heifer and Commercial Heifer division but are only permitted to sell one market heifer in the auction if they have animals qualify for auction in both divisions. An exception to this rule will be made if both heifers receive Champion titles, as all Grand and Reserve Champion projects must sell.
9. Exhibitors are permitted to tag in up to two Commercial Heifers but may exhibit only one heifer in the market class.
10. Exhibitors should feed heifers to promote growth rather than finish. Nurse cows are not allowed during the feeding period. Exhibitors may consult 4-H leaders, County Extension Agents and/or AFNR Teachers to receive help with developing a sound feeding program.
11. A heifer that is entered and checked in to a market division MAY NOT be shown in the Breeding Beef division. However, should an exhibitor tag two Commercial Heifers, they may show one of those animals in the Commercial Heifer Show and the other in the Breeding Beef Show, if they are entered appropriately.
12. All heifers must be shown by their owner. Exhibitors participating in the Combined Market Heifer Showmanship class must use the animal with which they competed in their regular class.
13. Exhibitors in any division with unruly animals will be given two chances to control their animals. After the second chance has been given, show officials may ask the exhibitor to leave the arena with their animal and be disqualified from that division.
14. If a calf is unruly and must be tied to the fence the judge will be advised that the calf should be placed last in the class.
15. Show classes will be broken by check in weight.

16. Only one parent/guardian is permitted to stand in the holding pen with each exhibitor and their calf. No other persons are allowed in this area.
17. All animals must stay in the assigned barn. Animals must be fed, watered or hayed in designated areas. All animals must be in the barn by 10 p.m. or 30 minutes after the last show of the day, whichever is later.
18. All appropriate General Rules apply to exhibitors and projects in this division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to read through those rules carefully and seek clarification before the show regarding any confusion.

F-1 Heifer Division

1. All F-1 Heifers must be entered by the date and according to the method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
2. All F-1 Heifer entries must attend the mandatory Large Animal Tag In (see Important Dates page) at White Memorial Park to be tattooed, tagged and weighed.
 - a. The CCYPS will accept major show validation tags in lieu of inserting a new tag into the animal's ear at tag in, but the animal **MUST** be tattooed with the unique CCYPS mark at tag in to be shown.
3. Heifers must have been born on or after December 1, 2024 and must have been born as the result of breeding a purebred Brahman with any other recognized purebred beef animal. F-1 Heifers cannot exceed 50 percent Brahman lineage.
4. Exhibitors must provide registration paperwork which shows that the F-1 Heifer is either Certified or Golden Certified by the American Brahman Breeders Association (ABBA) at the time of tag in. A copy of this paperwork must be turned in to the CCYPS Office no later than the deadline listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook. Failure to submit registration paperwork by the designated date may result in the animal being moved from the commercial F-1 Heifer division to the AOB/unregistered breeding beef division and being barred from participation in the auction or barn sale.
5. Heifers must be branded or tattooed with an ID number before check in.
6. Exhibitors may enter both the F-1 Heifer and Commercial Heifer division but are only permitted to sell one market heifer in the auction if they have animals qualify for auction in both divisions. An exception to this rule will be made if both heifers receive Champion titles, as all Grand and Reserve Champion projects must sell.
7. F-1 Heifers may have been purchased from anywhere in the United States.
8. Exhibitors may tag in up to two F-1 Heifers but may exhibit only one in the market show.
9. Exhibitors should feed heifers to promote growth rather than finish. Nurse cows are not allowed during the feeding period. Exhibitors may consult 4-H leaders, County Extension Agents and/or AFNR Teachers to receive help with developing a sound feeding program.
10. A heifer that is entered and checked in to a market division MAY NOT be shown in the Breeding Beef division. However, should an exhibitor tag two F-1 Heifers, they may show one of those animals in the F-1 Heifer Show and the other in the Breeding Beef Show, if they are entered appropriately.
11. All heifers must be shown by their owner. Exhibitors participating in the Combined Market Heifer Showmanship class must use the animal with which they competed in the regular class.
12. Show classes will be broken by tag in weight.
13. Only one parent/guardian is permitted to stand in the holding pen with each exhibitor and their calf. No other persons are permitted in this area.
14. Exhibitors in any division with unruly animals will be given two chances to control their animals. After the second chance has been given, show officials may ask the exhibitor to leave the arena with their animal and be disqualified from that division.
15. If a calf is unruly and must be tied to the fence the judge will be advised that the calf should be placed last in the class.

16. All animals must stay in the assigned barn. Animals must be fed, watered or hayed in designated areas. All animals must be in the barn by 10 p.m. or 30 minutes after the last show of the day, whichever is later.
17. All appropriate General Rules apply to exhibitors and projects in this division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to read through those rules carefully and seek clarification before the show regarding any confusion.

Chambers County Steer Division

1. All Chambers County Steers must be entered by the date and according to the method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
2. All Chambers County Steer entries must attend the mandatory Large Animal Tag In (see Important Dates page) at White Memorial Park to be tattooed, tagged and weighed.
 - a. The CCYPS will accept major show validation tags in lieu of inserting a new tag into the animal's ear at tag in, but the animal **MUST** be tattooed with the unique CCYPS mark at tag in to be shown.
3. A completed, notarized Chambers County Steer Agreement must be turned in at the time of tag in with the breeder's signature and her address. Failure to submit this form may result in reclassification of the animal or barring from participation.
4. Purebred, grade or crossbred steers of any breed which have been born and raised in Chambers County are eligible to enter this division.
5. Each exhibitor is permitted to tag in a maximum of two Chambers County Steers but may show only one. No replacement steers are permitted after Large Animal Tag In.
6. Exhibitors may enter steers in both the Chambers County Steer and Commercial Steer divisions but may only sell one steer in the auction. An exception to this rule will be made if both steers receive Champion titles, as all Grand and Reserve Champion projects must sell.
7. Chambers County Steers may be family tagged, but steers are not permitted to be family tagged across divisions (for example, a Chambers County Steer and a Commercial Steer cannot be family tagged).
8. Steers without an official ear tag and whose exhibitors have not notified the Division Chair of the tag's loss will not be weighed in on the check in date.
9. Steers must weigh a minimum of 1,000 pounds at check in. A 10 pound tolerance will be allowed.
10. Chambers County Steers will be divided into classes based on check in weight if the number of entries warrants.
11. All animals must be halter broken and led by halter while being judged.
12. All steers must be shown by their owner. Exhibitors participating in the Commercial Beef Showmanship class must use the animal with which they competed in the regular class.
13. Only one parent/guardian is permitted to stand in the holding pen with each exhibitor and their calf. No other persons are permitted in this area.
14. Exhibitors in any division with unruly animals will be given two chances to control their animals. After the second chance has been given, show officials may ask the exhibitor to leave the arena with their animal and be disqualified from that division.
15. If a calf is unruly and must be tied to the fence the judge will be advised that the calf should be placed last in the class.
16. All animals must stay in the assigned barn. Animals must be fed, watered or hayed in designated areas. All animals must be in the barn by 10 p.m. or 30 minutes after the last show of the day, whichever is later.

17. All appropriate General Rules apply to exhibitors and projects in this division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to read through those rules carefully and seek clarification before the show regarding any confusion.

Commercial Steer Division

1. All Commercial Steers must be entered by the date and according to the method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
2. All Commercial Steer entries must attend the mandatory Large Animal Tag In (see Important Dates page) at White Memorial Park to be tattooed, tagged and weighed.
 - a. The CCYPS will accept major show validation tags in lieu of inserting a new tag into the animal's ear at tag in, but the animal **MUST** be tattooed with the unique CCYPS mark at tag in to be shown.
3. Purebred, grade or crossbred steers of any breed are eligible to enter this division.
4. Each exhibitor is permitted to tag in a maximum of two Commercial Steers but may show only one. No replacement steers are permitted after Large Animal Tag In.
5. Exhibitors may enter steers in both the Chambers County Steer and Commercial Steer divisions but may only sell one steer in the auction. An exception to this rule will be made if both steers receive Champion titles, as all Grand and Reserve Champion projects must sell.
6. Commercial Steers may be family tagged, but steers are not permitted to be family tagged across divisions (for example, a Chambers County Steer and a Commercial Steer cannot be family tagged).
7. Steers without an official ear tag and whose exhibitors have not notified the Division Chair of the tag's loss will not be weighed in on the check in date.
8. Steers must weigh a minimum of 1,000 pounds at check in. A 10 pound tolerance will be allowed.
9. Commercial Steers will be divided into classes based on check in weight if the number of entries warrants.
10. All animals must be halter broken and led by halter while being judged.
11. All steers must be shown by their owner. Exhibitors participating in the Commercial Beef Showmanship class must use the animal with which they competed in the regular class.
12. Only one parent/guardian is permitted to stand in the holding pen with each exhibitor and their calf. No other persons are permitted in this area.
13. Exhibitors in any division with unruly animals will be given two chances to control their animals. After the second chance has been given, show officials may ask the exhibitor to leave the arena with their animal and be disqualified from that division.
14. If a calf is unruly and must be tied to the fence the judge will be advised that the calf should be placed last in the class.
15. All animals must stay in the assigned barn. Animals must be fed, watered or hayed in designated areas. All animals must be in the barn by 10 p.m. or 30 minutes after the last show of the day, whichever is later.
16. All appropriate General Rules apply to exhibitors and projects in this division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to read through those rules carefully and seek clarification before the show regarding any confusion.

Breeding Beef Division

1. Purebred, grade or crossbred cattle of any breed are eligible to enter the Breeding Beef show.
2. All Breeding Beef cattle must be entered by the date and according to the method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
3. All registered cattle must have a copy of registration paperwork that lists the exhibitor as the registered owner on file with the CCYPS Office. These papers must be turned in by the Breeding Beef entry deadline. All cattle with papers that are pending or which do not verify ownership must be shown in the Other Breeds category.
4. No bulls over 36 months of age will be allowed to show. All bulls must be shown with a nose ring or nose restraint.
5. All Breeding Beef cattle must check in with the CCYPS Office on the morning of the show.
6. All animals must be halter broken and led by a halter while being judged. The use of showmanship paraphernalia is encouraged.
7. Calves must be fitted and groomed for the show.
8. All animals must be shown by the owner. A substitute exhibitor may be used only if an exhibitor has more than one animal in a class. The substitute exhibitor will not be eligible to participate in the Showmanship Class.
9. Exhibitors who are not present at the gate at the time of show will have their projects immediately sifted.
10. Exhibitors must show an animal with which they participated in a regular class if they choose to participate in Breeding Beef Showmanship.
11. F-1 Heifers and Commercial Heifers checked in and/or shown in a market division are not eligible for competition in the Breeding Beef Division.
12. Exhibitors in any division with unruly animals will be given two chances to control their animals. After the second chance has been given, show officials may ask the exhibitor to leave the arena with their animal and be disqualified from that division.
13. If a calf is unruly and must be tied to the fence the judge will be advised that the calf should be placed last in the class.
14. All appropriate General Rules apply to exhibitors and projects in this division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to read through those rules carefully and seek clarification before the show regarding any confusion.

Commercial Swine Division

1. Purebred or crossbred barrows or gilts of any breed are eligible to enter this show. Animals may be purchased from anywhere in the United States.
2. All Commercial Swine must be entered by the date and according to the method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
3. All swine must be tagged in at White Memorial Park at the required Small Animal Tag In (see Important Dates page).
4. Each exhibitor is permitted to tag in up to two swine but is only allowed to show one. Exhibitors must designate which hog they will show at the time of check in. No replacement animals will be permitted after Small Animal Tag In.
5. Clean hogs cannot weigh less than 230 pounds or more than 290 pounds, with a 10-pound tolerance, at the time of check in. Hogs that do not meet these weight limits will be reweighed one time, immediately after zeroing the scales.
6. Hogs will be weighed immediately after coming off the trailer. Sifted animals must be loaded directly back onto the trailer and removed from the show grounds.
7. Ear tags must be clean enough to be read by show officials at check in.
8. Exhibitors who elect to participate in Swine Showmanship must show with the hog with which they competed in the regular division.
9. Exhibitors in any division with unruly animals will be given two chances to control their animals. After the second chance has been given, show officials may ask the exhibitor to leave the arena with their animal and be disqualified from that division.
10. All exhibitors must have their hogs fed and watered and all show equipment removed from the Pig Barn by 9 a.m. on the day of release.
11. All animals must stay in the assigned barn. Animals must be fed, watered or hayed in designated areas. All animals must be in the barn by 10 p.m. or 30 minutes after the last show of the day, whichever is later.
12. All appropriate General Rules apply to exhibitors and projects in this division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to read through those rules carefully and seek clarification before the show regarding any confusion.

Market Goat Division

1. Any Spanish or dairy goat, cross or purebred, wether or open doe will be allowed to enter the Market Goat Division.
2. All Market Goats must be entered by the date and according to the method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
3. All goats must be tagged and tattooed in at White Memorial Park at the required Small Animal Tag In (see Important Dates page).
4. Each exhibitor is permitted to tag in two goats, however they are allowed to show only one goat in the competition. Exhibitors must designate which goat they will show at the time of check in. No replacement goats will be allowed after Small Animal Tag In.
5. Goats must be clipped before check in.
6. Goats must weigh a minimum of 60 pounds and not exceed a maximum of 125 pounds (with a 10-pound tolerance) at check in. Goats that do not meet this weight criteria will be immediately reweighed after zeroing the scales. Sifted goats must be removed from the grounds immediately.
7. Goats may only wear a halter and no other garments or paraphernalia when on the scale for weighing. All covers and leg wraps must be removed prior to weighing the animal to ensure accurate measurement.
8. The Market Goat Division will be separated into weight classes if warranted by the number of entries.
9. Goats must be washed and dried at the time of the show.
10. Goats may be shown with halters, collars, chains or by hand. Exhibitors are strongly encouraged to present animals correctly by bracing during judging.
11. Only one parent or guardian is permitted to stand in the holding pen with each exhibitor and their animal. No other persons are allowed.
12. Exhibitors in any division with unruly animals will be given two chances to control their animals. After the second chance has been given, show officials may ask the exhibitor to leave the arena with their animal and be disqualified from that division.
13. Exhibitors who elect to participate in Showmanship must use the animal with which they participated in the regular division.
14. All animals must stay in the assigned barn. Animals must be fed, watered or hayed in designated areas. All animals must be in the barn by 10 p.m. or 30 minutes after the last show of the day, whichever is later.
15. Exhibitors or their acting agent are required to be present at the time of release to load their animal onto the appropriate vehicle or trailer.
16. All appropriate General Rules apply to exhibitors and projects in this division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to read through those rules carefully and seek clarification before the show regarding any confusion.

Market Lamb Division

1. Any breed or cross, wether or ewe will be allowed to enter the Market Lamb division. No milking ewes are permitted, however.
2. All Market Lambs must be entered by the date and according to the method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
3. All lambs must be tagged and tattooed in at White Memorial Park at the required Small Animal Tag In (see Important Dates page).
4. Each exhibitor is permitted to tag in two lambs, however they are allowed to show only one lamb in the competition. Exhibitors must designate which lamb they will show at the time of check in. No replacement lambs will be allowed after Small Animal Tag In.
5. Lambs must be shorn from knee and hock up before check in. Lambs with excessive wool (any amount greater than a ¼ inch day growth) will not be weighed.
6. Lambs must weigh a minimum of 100 pounds and not exceed a maximum of 180 pounds (with a 10-pound tolerance) at check in. Lambs that do not meet this weight criteria will be immediately reweighed after zeroing the scales. Sifted lambs must be removed from the grounds immediately.
7. Lambs may only wear a halter and no other garments or paraphernalia when on the scale for weighing. All covers and leg wraps must be removed prior to weighing the animal to ensure accurate measurement.
8. Depending on the number of lambs checked in, lambs may be penned together. Should this become necessary, lambs will be penned with other animals from the exhibitor's 4-H Club or FFA Chapter when possible.
9. Only one parent or guardian is permitted to stand in the holding pen with each exhibitor and their animal. No other persons are permitted.
10. Exhibitors in any division with unruly animals will be given two chances to control their animals. After the second chance has been given, show officials may ask the exhibitor to leave the arena with their animal and be disqualified from that division.
11. Exhibitors who elect to participate in Market Lamb Showmanship must use the animal with which they competed in the regular class.
12. Exhibitors or their acting agent are required to be present at the time of release to load their animal onto the appropriate vehicle or trailer.
13. All appropriate General Rules apply to exhibitors and projects in this division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to read through those rules carefully and seek clarification before the show regarding any confusion.

Market Rabbit Division

1. Exhibitors may enter only one pen of three fryers. This pen may be made up of male, female or a combination of both male and female fryers.
2. Each exhibitor must enter their pen of rabbits by the date and according to the method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
3. Fryers must be the property of the exhibitor as of the mandatory validation date listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook and must be continuously fed and cared for by the exhibitor from validation through show.
4. Fryers should be no more than 70 days of age at the time of the show and weigh between 3 ½ and 5 ½ pounds. Age will be determined by the judge. Any fryers not meeting these qualifications will be sifted. The decision of the judge is final.
5. Fryers must be permanently and legibly marked by tattooing the left ear. Tattoos may contain numerals 0 through 9 and/or letters A through Z.
6. Only persons appointed by the Rabbit Division Chair may be behind the judging table.
7. Exhibitors who sell fryers in either the Barn Sale or Auction must contact their buyers and arrange for delivery within 30 days of the close of the show and are required to complete the Market Broiler and Market Rabbit Delivery Certification Form.
8. All market rabbits which qualify for auction or are designated as an auction alternate are required to stay on show premises after the show. Animals may only be removed from grounds on the release date after checking in with the Division Chair. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to feed and water the animal(s) during this time.
9. ARBA Disqualification Guidelines for Commercial Meat Pen Rabbits
 - a. Meat pens should consist of three rabbits, all of the same breed and variety that are no more than 70 days of age and weigh between 3 ½ and 5 ½ pounds
 - i. If any one rabbit in the pen is over or underweight, the entire pen shall be disqualified
 - ii. If any one rabbit in the pen is disqualified, the entire pen shall be disqualified
 - iii. All ARBA disqualifications from the competition and breed disqualifications from competition apply to each meat pen with the following exceptions:
 1. Body smut on Californian marked animals
 2. Non-descended testicles on bucks
10. Judging criteria
 - a. Meat type – 40 points
 - b. Condition of flesh – 30 points
 - c. Uniformity of body weight – 20 points
 - d. Fur – 10 points
 - e. Total – 100 points

Breeding Rabbit Division

1. All Breeding Rabbits must be entered by the date and according to the method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
2. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to enter their rabbits correctly based breed and sex. Any rabbits entered into the wrong class or listed under the wrong sex will be sifted.
3. All decisions made by the judge will be final.
4. Exhibitors are responsible for getting the animal to and from the table.
5. No crossbred rabbits or does with litters may be shown. All breeds of rabbit must be found in the ARBA Standard of Perfection.
6. Rabbits must be permanently and legibly marked by tattooing the left ear. Tattoos may contain numerals 0 through 9 and/or letters A through Z.
7. Only persons designated by the Rabbit Division Chair are permitted to be behind the judging table.
8. Breeding Rabbits are not required to stay on grounds after the show.
9. ARBA Disqualification Guidelines for Breeding Rabbits
 - a. Poor tail carriage – permanently set to either side or permanently out of line; if a portion of the tail is missing or if it is a bobtail or screw tail
 - b. Poor ear carriage or torn ear with missing portion
 - c. Flabby or overly fat
 - d. Thin and extremely poor flesh condition
 - e. Stray color hair in white fur breeds, smut or unusable portion of pelt, excessive white hair in colored breed
 - f. Rabbit in molt or pelt out of condition in any other way (but not diseased)
 - g. Presence of ear canker, vent disease, pot belly, abscesses, mange, fungus growth or sore hocks
 - h. Abnormal eye discharge
 - i. Rupture, hernia, tumor or abnormal swelling
 - j. Overweight or underweight
 - k. Blindness in one or both eyes
 - l. Crooked legs – bent, bowed, deformed or cow hocked
 - m. Off colored eyes for breed
 - n. Buck, wolf, broken or missing teeth; teeth with no overlap of upper teeth
 - o. Missing toenails, including dew claw. Colored breeds must have dark toenails. White breeds must have white toenails. A broken toenail is accepted if pigmentation can be determined. Unmatched toenail on same foot is unacceptable.
 - p. Altering appearance – dying, plucking, trimming or clipping fur as to alter appearance. Any modifications including powdering and indiscriminate use of grooming preparation
 - q. Any animal exhibiting vicious and uncontrollable aggression which endangers safety of the judge may be disqualified from the class

Commercial Broiler Division

1. Broiler orders are due to the CCYPS Office by the date listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook. The order form will serve as an exhibitor's entry. Incorrectly completed order forms will be rejected. No late entries will be accepted.
2. Only birds purchased through the CCYPS will be eligible to compete in the Commercial Broiler show. Cost per bird will be announced prior to the order deadline (prices vary by year).
3. Members of the same household do not need to establish individual ownership of birds.
4. Exhibitors must verify wing band numbers on broilers when received at the CCYPS Office. Broiler wing band numbers will be checked by show officials at the time of judging. Should band numbers not match those assigned to the exhibitor at the time of pick up, that exhibitor and their broilers will be disqualified from the show.
5. Exhibitors assume all responsibility for animals and wing bands. CCYPS will not replace lost wing bands and birds without wing bands will not be permitted to show.
6. Exhibitors may only show three birds. They may, however, bring one alternate bird in the case that one of their chosen birds is sifted by the judge. Exhibitors are not permitted to bring any other birds if both the originals and the alternate are sifted.
7. Exhibitors are required to find other young people to assist in holding broilers as needed during judging.
8. Exhibitors who sell broilers in either the Auction or Barn Sale must deliver them dressed and frozen to their buyers within 30 days of the close of the show and are required to complete the Market Broiler and Market Rabbit Delivery Certification Form.
9. After judging, exhibitors who qualify for auction or are designated as an auction alternate are required to leave one bird on show premises. Animals may only be removed from grounds on the release date after checking in with the Division Chair. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to feed and water the animal(s) during this time.
10. All broilers should be removed from show grounds no later than 10 a.m. on release day.

Open Poultry Division

1. All entries must be submitted by the deadline and method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
2. The Open Poultry Division is open to all types of poultry.
3. Birds should be classed according to the following guidelines:
 - a. Standard breeds: egg layers, meat chickens
 - b. Fancy breeds: standard, bantams
 - c. Other breeds: turkeys, ducks, geese, pigeons
4. All exhibitors must have a current Pollorum-Typhoid report on their flock before the show. Exhibitors can contact the TVMDL PT Program at 979-450-5418 to have their birds tested. A copy of State Health Papers must be presented to show officials BEFORE animals are removed from the exhibitors' vehicle.
5. Birds must be at least 16 weeks of age at the time of the show to be exhibited.
6. Entries should not be penned before the official check in.
7. Each exhibitor is required to be present when their pen is being judged unless given other directions by the Poultry Division Chair.
8. Open Poultry entries are not required to stay on premises after judging, but should be provided with proper food and water while on grounds.
9. All poultry should be removed from show grounds no later than 10 a.m. on release day.

Calf Scramble Contest

1. Exhibitors interested in participating in either the Calf Scramble must submit their application by the deadline and via the method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
2. Participants will be selected by the CCYPS Livestock Committee. No participant substitutions will be permitted unless approved in advance by the Livestock Committee.
3. Exhibitors may not participate in any CCYPS Scramble event if they received any type of scramble sponsorship from the CCYPS the previous year.
4. The Calf Scramble contest will be divided into two age groups:
 - a. Junior – 9 to 13-years-old
 - b. Senior – 14 to 18-years-old
5. Exhibitors who are awarded sponsorships will receive \$500, disbursed in two payments. The first payment will total \$400 and be released at a mandatory CCYPS Scramble Contestant meeting in the fall after the show. The remaining \$100 will be released at the completion of the following year's CCYPS, pending the participant has satisfactorily completed their responsibilities. See the Scramble Reporting page of this Rulebook for additional information on those responsibilities.
6. Exhibitors who receive sponsorships are required to turn in monthly reports documenting the growth of the animal and the expenses used to raise that animal. Exhibitors are also required to submit a final Record Book. See Record Keeping page for more information.
7. Scramble animals must attend tag in – even breeding beef cattle. During tag in, cattle purchased with scramble monies must be designated by being tagged with a different colored tag. Breeding beef animals must have their assigned scramble tag in hand at the Show to check in.
8. Scramble animals cannot be family-tagged.
9. Exhibitors who receive sponsorships may tag in up to two animals in the division which they choose to enter, but MUST turn in a scramble report (with correct ear tag number) for BOTH animals.
10. Scramble animals may not be shown at any other market show.
11. All breeding beef cattle purchased with scramble sponsorship monies must have been born between January 1, 2025 and October 21, 2025, with the exception of F-1 Heifers which must meet age requirements as listed in that division's rules.

By participating in this contest, the exhibitor agrees to the following terms:

- The exhibitor agrees to feed and care for the animal from time of purchase to time of show under the direction of an AFNR educator, County Extension Agent or 4-H Adult Leader
- The exhibitor agrees to halter break and train the animal and show it at the following year's CCYPS
- The exhibitor has the consent and cooperation of their parent(s)/legal guardian(s) and must provide a signed and notarized copy of the Minor's Release and Agreement at time of application
- The exhibitor must be reliable and trustworthy

- The exhibitor is not permitted to sell, trade or dispose of the animal without the approval of the CCYPS Livestock Committee until after being shown at the following year's CCYPS
- The exhibitor understands that if they fail to show at the following year's CCYPS, all monies awarded must be returned to the CCYPS within 30 days of the close of the Show
- The exhibitor understands that scramble cattle must be shown in their designated division (by breed/classification) – e.g. English Females or Commercial Steers
- The exhibitor is only permitted to participate in one CCYPS scramble event annually
- The exhibitor understands that they should clearly display their name, club and sponsor information when stalling the animal during any show

Contest procedures:

1. Participants will be placed in the arena by committee members and the animals will be released from the south end of the Arena
2. Participants will be provided with a rope halter; the rope halter cannot be used as a lariat and must be placed on the calf's head correctly. All halters must be returned to the CCYPS office at the end of the scramble
3. Each participant should attempt to catch and halter one of the calves released. Once a participant catches a calf, they must halter it and lead it back across the designated finish line
4. If a participant is touching a calf, no other participant may touch it unless it breaks free
5. If a participant catches an animal by the tail, the participant will be given a reasonable amount of time to work their way to the head of the animal before they are instructed to release the animal and begin again
6. If two or more participants catch the same animal at the same time, the animal will be turned loose
7. Undue roughness will not be tolerated and poor sportsmanship will result in automatic disqualification

Small Animal Scramble Contest

1. Exhibitors interested in participating in either the Small Animal Scramble must submit their application by the deadline and via the method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
2. Participants will be selected by the CCYPS Livestock Committee. No participant substitutions will be permitted unless approved in advance by the Livestock Committee.
3. Exhibitors may not participate in any CCYPS Scramble event if they received any type of scramble sponsorship from the CCYPS the previous year.
4. The Calf Scramble contest will be divided into two age groups:
 - a. Junior – 9 to 13-years-old
 - b. Senior – 14 to 18-years-old
5. Exhibitors who are awarded sponsorships will receive \$200, disbursed in two payments. The first payment will total \$150 and be released at a mandatory CCYPS Scramble Contestant meeting in the fall after the show. The remaining \$50 will be released at the completion of the following year's CCYPS, pending the participant has satisfactorily completed their responsibilities. See the Scramble Reporting page of this Rulebook for additional information on those responsibilities.
6. Exhibitors who receive sponsorships are required to turn in monthly reports documenting the growth of the animal and the expenses used to raise that animal. Exhibitors are also required to submit a final Record Book. See Record Keeping page for more information.
7. Scramble animals must attend tag in. During tag in, animals purchased with scramble monies must be designated by being tagged with a different colored tag.
8. Scramble animals cannot be family-tagged.
9. Exhibitors who receive sponsorships may tag in up to two animals in the division which they choose to enter, but MUST turn in a scramble report (with correct ear tag number) for BOTH animals.
10. Scramble animals may not be shown at any other market show.

By participating in this contest, the exhibitor agrees to the following terms:

- The exhibitor agrees to feed and care for the animal from time of purchase to time of show under the direction of an AFNR educator, County Extension Agent or 4-H Adult Leader
- The exhibitor agrees to halter break and train the animal and show it at the following year's CCYPS
- The exhibitor has the consent and cooperation of their parent(s)/legal guardian(s) and must provide a signed and notarized copy of the Minor's Release and Agreement at time of application
- The exhibitor must be reliable and trustworthy
- The exhibitor is not permitted to sell, trade or dispose of the animal without the approval of the CCYPS Livestock Committee until after being shown at the following year's CCYPS
- The exhibitor understands that if they fail to show at the following year's CCYPS, all monies awarded must be returned to the CCYPS within 30 days of the close of the Show

- The exhibitor is only permitted to participate in one CCYPS scramble event annually
- The exhibitor understands that they should clearly display their name, club and sponsor information when stalling the animal during any show

Contest procedures:

1. Participants will be placed in the arena by committee members and the animals will be released from the south end of the Arena
2. Participants will attempt to catch animals released. Once a participant catches an animal, they must hold the animal in the same place until a committee member comes to verify a clean catch
3. If a participant is touching an animal, no other participant may touch it unless it breaks free
4. If two or more participants catch the same animal at the same time, the animal will be turned loose
5. Undue roughness will not be tolerated and poor sportsmanship will result in automatic disqualification

Record Keeping Report Guidelines

Note: these guidelines should be followed by scramble exhibitors and any exhibitor who wishes to compete for the Recordkeeping Award.

Large and Small Animal Scramble participants who either catch animals or who are awarded “hard luck” sponsorships are required to turn in monthly reports documenting the growth of their animal and the expenses used to raise this animal. These scramblers are also required to turn in a final Record Book, made from their compiled monthly reports as well as supplemental materials.

Effective this year, all Record Keeping Reports will be submitted digitally at bit.ly/CCYPSScrambleReports. The link is case sensitive.

- The CCYPS Office will forward copies of submitted reports to the CCYPS Livestock Committee, the scramble participant's sponsor and AFNR/4-H Advisor.

Reports, as well as any supplemental information the scrambler would like to include (i.e. photos), should be placed in unsealed, addressed, and stamped envelopes and be delivered either by hand to the CCYPS Office during regular business hours or be placed in a larger envelope and mailed to the CCYPS Livestock Committee at PO Box F, Anahuac, TX 77514.

Below is the report deadline schedule:

Late or missing reports will result in a deduction from the scrambler's final payout. A \$20 penalty will be assessed for each late Large Animal Scramble Report. A \$5 penalty will be assessed for each late Small Animal Scramble Report. Any missing monthly reports will lead to the participant forfeiting their entire final payment.

Any scrambler who fails to submit any reports at all or fails to submit the final Record Book will be required to return all sponsorship funds earned.

Greased Pig Scramble Contest

1. Entries must be submitted by the date and method listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook. A signed and notarized Minor's Release and Agreement is required for participation.
2. Participants must be aged 5 to 8-years-old at the time of the contest.
3. Participants will be selected from entries by the CCYPS Livestock Committee using a lottery drawing. A total of 10 participants and three alternates will be selected for each age group.
4. A parent/guardian must be present at the time of the contest.
5. Contestants should report to the north end of the Pig Barn no later than 30 minutes prior to the scramble.
6. Should a participant catch a pig and successfully bring it across the finish line, they will receive a \$100 scramble sponsorship. This money will be disbursed in two payments. The first payment will be made in the amount of \$75 at a fall CCYPS Livestock Committee meeting. The remaining \$25 will be disbursed after the completion of the following year's CCYPS, pending satisfactory completion of responsibilities.

By applying to this contest, the exhibitor agrees to the following requirements:

- The contestant certifies that they have the consent and cooperation of their parent(s)/legal guardian(s).
- The participant must be reliable and trustworthy.
- The contestant agrees to feed and care for an animal from the time of receipt until show under the direction of an AFNR educator, County Extension Agent or 4-H Adult Leader.
- If a scholarship is received, the contestant agrees to show a breeding rabbit, pen of market rabbits, open poultry, pen of broilers, commercial swine, lamb or goat project at the following year's CCYPS.
- The exhibitor is not permitted to sell, trade or dispose of the animal without the approval of the CCYPS Livestock Committee until after being shown at the following year's CCYPS
- The exhibitor understands that if they fail to show at the following year's CCYPS, all monies awarded must be returned to the CCYPS within 30 days of the close of the Show
- The exhibitor is only permitted to participate in one CCYPS scramble event annually
- The exhibitor understands that if they fail to show at the following year's CCYPS, all monies awarded must be returned to the CCYPS within 30 days of the close of the Show

Contest procedures:

- Participants will be placed in the arena by committee members and animals will be released from the south end of the pig barn
- Each participant will attempt to catch an animal and then bring it across the finish line
- Undue roughness will not be tolerated, and poor sportsmanship will result in immediate disqualification

Ag Mechanics Division

The purpose of this competition is to provide the youth of Chambers County with the opportunity to display and be judged on projects created in Agricultural Mechanics courses in school or at home, under the supervision of their parents and/or an AFNR teacher or Chambers County Extension Agent. Eligibility for this contest is determined by the General Rules in this Rulebook. Exhibitors who are interested in participating in this category should contact their AFNR teacher or County Extension Agent.

1. Projects may be individually or group constructed.
2. Projects must have been constructed and supervised in AFNR classrooms/shops or at home, under the supervision of an AFNR teacher or Chambers County Extension Agent.
3. All projects must be painted or properly treated and must be clean and in a presentable condition even though they may have been used.
4. A working plan or drawing and a bill of materials must be presented with each project. These plans must be submitted at the time of entry. No late entries will be accepted.
5. Projects must be delivered to the White Memorial Park Show Grounds in the designated Ag Mechanics project area by the date listed on the Important Dates Page of this Rulebook. Individual projects and junior projects should be set up close to one another when checking in to the show.
6. Entries will be judged according to the following criteria:
 - a. Workshop – 30 Points
 - b. Design and Materials Used – 20 Points
 - c. Functionality – 20 Points
 - d. Degree of Difficulty – 20 Points
 - e. Finish – 10 Points
 - f. Presentation – 20 Points
7. Ribbons will be awarded based on the following schedule:
 - a. Blue Ribbon – 105 to 120 Points
 - b. Red Ribbon – 90 to 104 Points
 - c. White Ribbon – Less than 89 Points
8. Projects will be grouped into three categories:
 - a. Individual Supervised Projects
 - b. Group Supervised Projects
 - c. Junior Division (8th Grade and Under)
9. Each of the three categories will be sub-divided into the following classes:
 - a. Class 1: Any project which has been refurbished, added on to or otherwise not built from scratch. Pictures of the project before work started must accompany entry forms.
 - b. Class 2: Livestock Equipment
 - c. Class 3: Trailers – Lowboys Under 12 Foot
 - d. Class 4: Trailers – Lowboys 12 Foot and Over
 - e. Class 5: All Gooseneck Trailers
 - f. Class 6: Fire Pits
 - g. Class 7: Cooking Equipment

- h. Class 8: Trailer Mounted Cooking Equipment
 - i. Class 9: Miscellaneous, Wildlife Projects, Shop Equipment
10. First place projects will be selected from the blue-ribbon projects in each class division; these projects will be awarded Rosettes and will then compete for Overall Grant and Reserve Champion of the Show in each division
 11. Once a project is in place it should not be moved until the official check out time. Exhibitors who remove their projects early will immediately be disqualified and will have their awards stripped. Project check out time is listed on the Important Dates page of this Rulebook.
 12. Projects may be made available for sale through private treaties. Contact information for exhibitors should be left on any projects that they wish to sell. Money will be exchanged directly between the buyer and seller.
 13. Every precaution will be taken to protect projects, however Chambers County, CCYPS, the CCYPS Livestock Committee and the Ag Mechanics Committee members cannot be held responsible for any losses or damages incurred.

Welding Division

ALL PARTICIPANTS MUST BE ENROLLED IN AN AFNR CLASS AT ONE OF THE 3 SCHOOLS IN CHAMBERS COUNTY

1. Safe work practices must be observed.
2. Contestants must provide their own proper PPE. (Safety glasses/goggles, welding hood, leather welding gloves, proper welding apparel and footwear.)
 - a. Contestants who fail to wear safety glasses or goggles during the event will receive one warning. A second violation will result in contestant disqualification.
3. Contestants are responsible for providing any other equipment/tools that will be needed to complete the skill for the contest.
4. The contestants will be split by level of experience: Novice (Completed 1-2 yrs. Ag Mech) & Experienced (Completed 3-4 yrs. Ag Mech)
5. In each experience category contestants will be divided into two divisions: male and female.
6. Contestants will be allowed five minutes to get familiar with the welding machines. Advisors may be present during this time. (practice metal will be provided by the chapter)
7. The welding competition coupon will take no more than 15 minutes. (Contestants taking longer will be disqualified)
8. Contestants must clean shop and welding stations once they are completed.
9. ONLY Ag Advisors and Contest Officials are allowed in the completion area . No students will be allowed to observe.
10. This competition will be tobacco free – contestants will be disqualified for the use of tobacco products. (including vape cigarettes)
11. All welding will be judged on general weld appearance based on the following point system:
 - a. Undercuts – 20 Points
 - b. Weld Appearance – 20 Points
 - c. Size – 20 Points
 - d. Weld Penetration – 20 Points
 - e. Porosity – 20 Points

Welding Division: Build Off Guidelines

(Chambers County Senior Grade Level Students only)

1. Build off contest project to be built by one group of 2 seniors from each of the 3 Chambers County schools.
2. Projects will be entered in placing order into the Auction all funds received will go towards senior scholarships.
3. Projects will be built by the two students in their schools Ag Mechanics shop with supervision of their FFA advisor.
4. ANY Welding process is allowed but must be done by the students in the school's Ag Mechanics shop.
5. Project must be finished (painted) ready for sale. The purpose of this project is to generate funds to go back to the students for scholarships.
6. Project plans and materials will be handed out to Advisors in January before the show. Projects are subject to change due to metal resources and Ag Mechanics Committee input.
7. Projects will be judged based on the following criteria:
 - a. Craftsmanship - 50 points
 - b. Finish/Paint - 25 points
 - c. Presentation/Salesmanship - 25 points
 - d. Total Points: 100 Points
8. Placings will be given out based on highest points received to the lowest points received

Pet Show Division

1. The CCYPS Pet Show is open to all Chambers County youth who are 10-years-old or younger as of the show date.
2. Entries are due the day of the show in the CCYPS Office.
3. All pets being exhibited must be either leashed or caged. No unrestrained animals will be allowed in the show ring.
4. All pets must have all state and locally required vaccinations to participate.
5. Special awards will be presented in categories selected by the judge. These awards may include: don with the longest ears, dog with the shortest tail, etc.
6. Classes for the Pet Show are as follows:
 - a. Cats
 - b. Small Dogs
 - c. Medium Dogs
 - d. Large Dogs
 - e. Furry Friends (rabbits, hamsters, etc.)
 - f. Feathered Friends (chickens, ducks, etc.)
 - g. Hooves (goats, horses, etc.)
 - h. Miscellaneous
