Public Health Updates

As of March 26, 2020 there are two confirmed cases in Chambers County.

The next two weeks are critical in slowing the spread of COVID-19. Stay home as much as possible. Limit close contact (six feet) with others. If you are sick or have mild symptoms, stay home and call your Primary Care Provider. If you feel like you have severe symptoms and need to go to the ER, please call ahead.

County Updates

Per Executive Order from County Judge Jimmy Sylvia, the following mandates are currently in place:

- All individuals residing in Chambers County are ordered to stay at their place of residence except for Essential Activities defined in the Judge's March 24 Executive Order (see Order for more information)
- All businesses operating within Chambers County EXCEPT those identified as essential (see Order for more information) are ordered to cease operation
- It is a crime for a person to sell any goods or services for more than the price the person charged for the goods or services on March 12, 2020 in ANY area within Chambers County. Price gouging should be report to the Chambers County Sheriff's Office at 409-267-2500
- **Only one person per family is permitted to enter grocery stores at a time, except in extraordinary circumstances**
